A SAMPLING OF SPEAKER BIOS...

Marcia Brim is a wife and Orthodox homeschool mother of three. She and her husband are publishers of Brim Wood Press materials for homeschool families. Marcia's degree is in theology from Multnomah Bible College. Her passion is to equip parents and students to be salt and light in a lost world.

John Granger, Orthodox homeschooling father of 7, and an Orthodox Christian Reader, is well known for explaining the artistry, meaning, and popularity of Joanne Rowling's Harry Potter novels. His four books, *How Harry Cast His Spell*, *Unlocking Harry Potter: Five Keys for the Serious Reader*, *The Deathly Hallows Lectures*, and *Harry Meets Hamlet and Scrooge: A Literary Companion to Harry Potter* are used in University classrooms from Princeton to Pepperdine.

Andrew Kern is the president and founder of the CiRCE (Center for Independent Research on Classical Education) Institute and the author of *Classical Education, the Movement Sweeping America* with Dr. Gene Edward Veith and *The Lost Tools of Writing*, the first thorough application of classical rhetoric to upper school writing.

Dr. Maria C. Khoury—Holy Land resident and Orthodox children's book author of the "Christina Books" (*Christina Learns the Sacraments*, *Christina Goes to Church*, *Christina's Favorite Saints*, *Christina's True Heroes*, *Christina Goes to the Holy Land*) and her most recent book for adults "Witness in the Holy Land"

Barbara Shukin is an Orthodox Christian mother of 5 and has homeschooled since the beginning using the Charlotte Mason and classical approaches. After receiving her MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, she taught for several years at the college level, and continues to teach by offering art classes for homeschoolers.
