O Christ, by thy Passion we have been saved from passion, and by thy Resurrection we have been saved from corruption. O Lord, glory to thee.







Thy Resurrection, O Christ Savior, hath illumined the whole universe. Thou hast renewed thy creation, O Lord Almighty. Glory to thee.





Thy Resurrection, O Christ our Savior, the angels in heaven praise. Make us, who also are on earth, worthy to praise thee with a pure heart.







Thou hast risen from the tomb, O Savior of the world, and hast raised mankind with thy body, O Lord, glory to thee.








